

dandi Garland

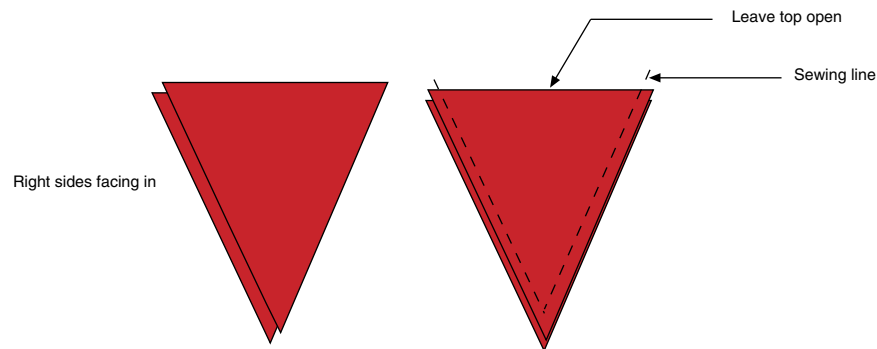
Materials required:

- Dandi fabric (4 fat quarters in 4 different colour ways)
- Sewing machine
- Sharp fabric scissors
- 4 metres of ribbon
- Co-ordinating coloured thread

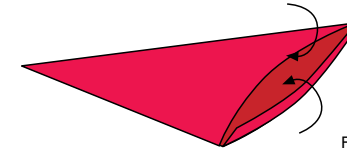
Instructions:

1. Select a triangle size from the Dandi template and cut out. Using the template as a guide cut out the fabric triangles with scissors. (If you have pinking shears you can save yourself sewing the seams)

2. Once you have all the triangles cut to size and the desired number you are ready to sew them. Take two fabric triangles and place on top of each other with the right sides facing in. Stitch the triangle along 2 sides, leaving the top open so you can easily turn them out. Repeat and sew the remaining cut trisnagles.

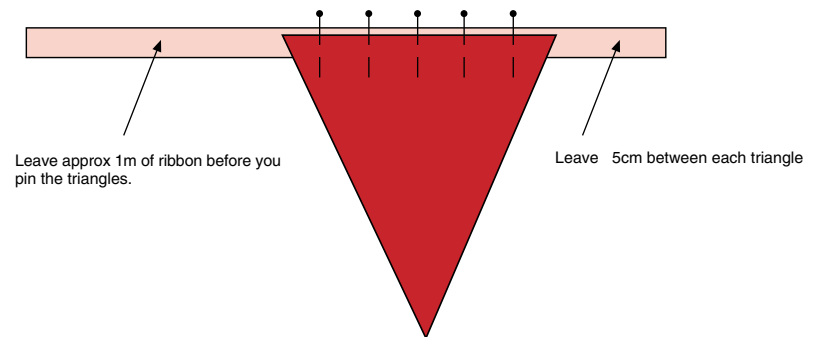


3. Turn each triangle inside out folding the seam allowance of the open edge inside. Iron seams in place

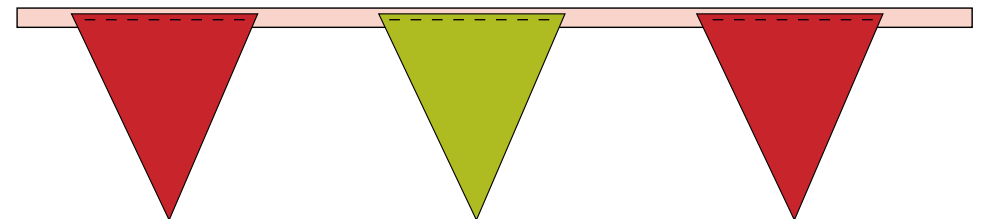


Fold seam allowance inside and iron

4. Place the triangles on top of the ribbon and pin in place, ensuring you leave enough ribbon at the start so you can tie the garland up easily, best to leave approx 1m. Pin the triangles with an equal distance between each triangle, approx 5cm is a good distance.



5. Stitch the triangles to the ribbon leaving a metre of ribbon at each end for tying.



Hang your completed garland up along your mantle piece, above a window or in the garden and enjoy your celebrations.
