

# dandi<sup>™</sup> Party Pinwheels

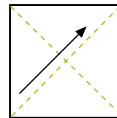
## Materials required:

Paper  
Dandi printed fabric  
Dandi plain-dyed fabric  
Ribbon (optional)  
Sticky tape (optional)  
Tacks or Pins  
Wooden dowel, round or square  
Scissors  
Beads

## Instructions:

1. Begin with a square of paper, the size of your pinwheel is up to you. We've done ours from 20cm squares with about 40cm dowel. If you decide to make them bigger then make sure your dowel is longer.

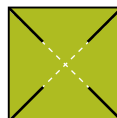
2. Fold your square, on the diagonals, then unfold.



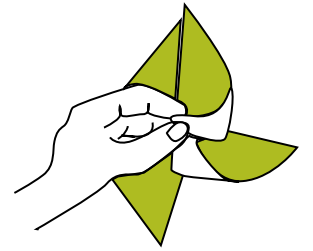
3. Cut fabric to size and glue one side of the paper with plain fabric and one side with patterned fabric, trimming the edges to get a perfect square.



4. Cut along diagonal fold lines, stopping 2/3 of the way to the centre.



5. Bring every second point of the square to the centre and stick your pin through all four points, and through the centre of the square. The pinwheel will rotate on the pin



6. Turn your pinwheel over – making sure the pin pokes through the exact centre at the back of the square

7. Twist the pin around in circles a few times to make the hole a little larger, this will make it spin easier in the wind.

8. Cut dowel to the right length, and if using, wrap in ribbon from top to bottom, securing each end with tape or fabric glue (you could also paint them in advance and let them dry).

Pop a bead on the pin, then stick pin into the top of the dowel. Voile! You're very own pretty party fabric pinwheel.
